


Irish NATIONAL CONFERENCE









May 24th to attend a National Social Farming event being hosted by SKDP at the dairy farm of John and Catherine Fleming at Muckross, Killarney, Co Kerry. Clare Gormley (Department of Agriculture, Food and Marine also attended. This event was part of ongoing work of the FarmElder, an Erasmus+ research project, of which SKDP is one of the Irish partners alongside TUS (Technological University of the Shannon).

Elaine Cleary TUS (Technological University of the Shannon) addressed the gathering, outlining the research and practical work of FarmElder, the **development of training modules and the outputs from the project**.

Host farmers shared their stories and explained how many older farmers are **giving their time every week to help people** with disabilities. Participants spoke about their experience of social farming. John Fleming led a farm walk and Tim Fleming gave a talk on the history of the farm.

Lunch was served on the farm allowing for host farmers, participants, family members, service providers, SKDP Staff and guests, including members of the local Active Retired group, the opportunity to discuss the project and share experiences. All participants enjoyed the fine weather and the very positive atmosphere, with the Flemings' Farm providing the perfect setting for the event.

A number of agencies working with older people across Kerry were in attendance, including SKDP RSS & Tus supervisors, providing information on the range of services and opportunities available for older people. Over 100 people attended in the course of the day, including representatives from all other social farming projects funded by the Department of Agriculture, Food and Marine, namely Rachel Budd (IRD Duhallow), Debbie Kelleher (Field of Dreams /Down Syndrome Cork) and Eadaoin O'Connell (West Limerick Resources/ Development Officer Social Farming Ireland).

The event was covered in **local media** including the Kerryman, Kerrys Eye **newspapers** and Killarney **Outlook paper**, as well as **nationally on Raidió** na Gaeltachta.
